## Letter Formation

Teach letters from one group before you work on letters in another group. It often takes several days for students to learn one new letter formation.

Step 1: Write the letter in the air
Step 2: Write the letter with a finger on the table
Step 3: Write the letter with a marker on a dry-erase board
Have the students say the letter name and the verbal direction as they make the letter.

# Group 1: Letters that start like a $c$ 

C
Go around like a C

Go around like a C , then close
Go around like a C, then down and hook left
a

## $q$

Go around like a $\mathbf{C}$, then go down
Go around like a $\mathbf{C}$, then up and down Go around like a C, down, and then take a U-turn

# Group 2: Letters that start like an $l$ 

Start at the top, then go down

## $\dagger$

Start at the top, go down, cross
h

Start at the top, go down, then make a hump
k
Start at the top, go down, in, then out
b

Start at the top, go down, and then around

## n

Start at the top, go down, up, then make a hump

## m

Start at the top, go down, make a hump and then another hump

Start at the top, go down, add a dot
